Tuesday April 28, 2020 the Center for Judaic Studies and Contemporary Jewish Life at the University of Connecticut, Stamford Campus will host a special panel discussion on the legacies of the European Jewish experience. The program will be moderated by Dr. Frederick Roden, Professor of English and Coordinator of the UConn Stamford Center for Judaic Studies and Contemporary Jewish Life.

Panelists will include Dr. Andrew Zalewski, vice president of Geshher Galicia (geshergalicia.org), an organization dedicated to the history of Jewish Galicia and author of two books on the subject; Leora Tec, founder of Bridge to Poland (bridgetopoland.org), that promotes dialogue between contemporary Poles and American Jews; and Ralph Berger, an editor of his parents' writings as members of the Bielski partisans who survived Nazism in the Belorussian forests, the subject of Nechama Tec's book *Defiance* and the film adaptation.
